


loads of documents needed from the plumber, electrician, fireman and building manager. We've had to make special changes to get our electric hook-up and for a fire truck turn around and extra things for bathrooms and a small kitchen. It's added time and unexpected costs and we'd really appreciate your prayers for grace in the eyes of the building commission which we hope to get here by the end of April. At half-time

the coach adjusts the game plan and we've had to do that as well. Our desire was to get a pool in for this summer but we literally do not have the time due to the challenges in getting our permit. Please pray with us! Time is of the essence because we need to officially register our camps by the beginning of June.



The Humility of Jesus' Self-Emptying

Philippians 2:7



"But emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men."

As part of His humble descent from Heaven to earth, Jesus set aside the exercise of His divine privileges.

The next step in Jesus' pattern of humility as He came to earth and lived among mankind was His emptying of Himself. But Scripture is clear that while on earth our Lord claimed to be God: "He who has seen Me has seen the Father" (John 14:9). At no time did He stop being God.

The Greek word for "emptied" gives us the theological term *kenosis*, the doctrine of Christ's self—emptying. The *kenosis* basically reminds us of what we saw in yesterday's lesson: Jesus' humble refusal to cling to His advantages and privileges in Heaven. The Son of God, who has a right to everything and is fully satisfied within Himself, voluntarily emptied Himself.



We have already noted that Jesus did not empty Himself of His deity, but He did lay aside certain prerogatives. For one thing, He gave up His heavenly glory. That's why, in anticipation of His return to the Father, Christ prayed, "Glorify Thou Me together with Thyself, Father, with the glory which I ever had with Thee before the world was" (John 17:5).

Jesus also relinquished His independent authority and completely submitted Himself to the Father's will: "Not as I will, but as Thou wilt" (Matt. 26:39).

During His time on earth, Christ also voluntarily limited the use and display of His divine attributes. One good illustration of this concerned His omniscience, His knowledge of all things. In teaching about the end–times and His second coming, Jesus said, "But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father alone" (Matt. 24:36).

Jesus' self-emptying demonstrates a wonderful aspect of the gospel. Unlike man-centered, works-oriented religions, the biblical gospel has God's Son willingly yielding His privileges to sacrifice Himself for sinners like us.

Suggestions for Prayer:

Pray that you would become more appreciative of the sacrificial humility Jesus Christ exercised on your behalf.

For Further Study:

Scripture does not record a lot about Jesus' boyhood. But the account we do have verifies His emptying. Read Luke 2:39–52. What does verse 47 imply about Jesus' nature? \$\diamonds\$ How do verses 51–52 exemplify His emptying?

Salt, Light, and Social Justice

What does it mean for twenty-first century believers to be salt and light in the world?

Is it a call to promote social justice—to stand up for the oppressed and the outcast? Or is it a mandate for activism and lobbying—to reshape society


through the political process? Does the church need to champion a moral agenda at home and abroad? Is it a call to redeem the culture?

Or is it something more?

We recently asked John MacArthur to help us understand how each of us is to function as salt and light in this sin-ruined world. Here's what he had to say:

Serving as salt and light is not about our social agenda it's about God's spiritual agenda. Those vivid metaphors of salt and light apply to the work of the gospel alone—not the social justice issue du jour.

This world is sprinting to hell. As Christians, we ought



to have a moral and social influence in our communities. We ought to use the rights granted to us to promote morality and decency in the public arena.

But that's not the sum total of our responsibility to this world. We can't settle for mere social change and behavior modification. We must bring the light of the truth to bear in a world blinded by sin. And we must do what we can to halt society's decay—not through protests and political action, but through the bold proclamation of the gospel.
